Research statement

I study normal and impaired visual word recognition using neurocognitive techniques such as functional magnetic resonance imaging, electroencephalography, eye tracking and computational modeling. Furthermore, I am fascinated by fallacies such as reverse inference (Hutzler, 2014) or the exponential growth bias (Hutzler et al., 2021). Most recently, my research group started working on ontology-based knowledge systems for objectively classifying neurocognitive datasets, including basic experimental aspects as well as superordinate neurocognitive concepts (Austrian NeuroCloud). With respect to the current proposal, I will act as the Coordinator and contribute my expertise in Project 1.
